Mentoring in the Bible




"So Joshua fought the Amalekites as Moses had ordered, and Moses, **Aaron** and **Hur** went to the top of the hill.





Mentoring Defined

A mentor is a tutor, coach, counselor, guide, and friend. It is someone whose experiences, insights, qualities and characteristics are transferred to someone else, facilitating that person's growth and development.

- 1. A wise, trusted counselor or teacher who is there to help
- 2. Mentor. *Greek Mythology*. Odysseus's trusted counselor, *under whose disguise Athena* became the guardian and teacher of Telemachos
- 3. It has always meant a helper, facilitation

Moving From Descriptive to Prescriptive

How can you deliberately experience a mentoring blessing and be a mentoring blessing?

We need a network of mentor relationships

■ Vertical — Upward (mentor)

Circular — Around (mentoree)

Horizontal — Across (mentor)

Your Mentoring Network Vertical — Upward (mentor)


■ We need Vertical (Upward Mentors) who have gone before us and can show the way...


Your Mentoring Network Circular Mentors (Peers)


■ ...Circular Mentors (Peers), who informally shake our complacency, renew our convictions, keep us on our toes, and multiply our ministry and provide accountability


Your Mentoring Network Horizontal — Across (mentor)

• ...and Horizontal Mentorees, who we know, we can identify with each other and someone(s) who would value from our experience and our insights; someone you can facilitate in ministry



Determine the level of the person you want to mentor and settle on the level of accountability and interaction.

Finding a Mentoree

- 1. Pray for a mentoree
- 2. Look for potential mentorees
- 3. Approach a potential mentoree
- 4. Arrange to meet regularly
- 5. Begin either officially or unofficially

The Mentoring Role

- 1. Caring Enough to Affirm
 - Building up!
 - **Hebrews 10:24**
- 2. Loving Enough to Confront
 - Tearing Down!
 - **Proverbs 27:5-6**

Mentoring Parameters

- 1. Establish the mentoring
- 2. Agree on the purpose of relating
- 3. Determine regularity of meeting
- 4. Determine type of accountability
- 5. Set up communication mechanisms

Mentoring Parameters


- 6. Clarify the level of confidentiality
- 7. Set life cycle of the relationship
- 8. Evaluate relationship periodically
- 9. Modify expectations to reality
- 10. Bring closure to the relationship

A Mentoring Plan

- 1. Meet once a week for an hour
- 2. Catch up on each other's lives
- 3. Ask probing questions
- 4. Practice listening
- 5. Spend time in prayer
- 6. Offer regular check ins
- 7. Spend informal time together

Mentoring Areas for Possible Discussion

- Sharing Scripture, Applying Principles
- Discussion and Prayer Intercession
- Encouragement and Wisdom Sharing
- SWOT, Solutioning; Leader Sharing
